


Equitably Fund Illinois' Public Universities for More Affordability and Access for Illinois Students

Over the past 15 years, Illinois has cut public university funding in half. As state support fell, universities had to charge more in tuition and provide fewer supports, pushing college out of reach for many. **The result was the steepest enrollment decline in the nation.**

As appropriations dropped by 36%, statewide enrollment fell by 19,400 students, a 9% decline since 2010.

An equitable formula would move Illinois from having no system for giving out funding to one that leads the nation, providing the path to adequate, equitable, and stable funding for every one of our state universities.



Passing and Funding SB 13/HB 1581 Will Put Illinois on a Better Path

The Adequate and Equitable Public University Funding Formula (SB13/HB1581) was developed through years of research and shaped by input from university leaders, faculty unions, advocates, and lawmakers. It calculates how much funding each public university needs based on its unique mission and student population, then directs new state dollars to all campuses—prioritizing those that have

been underfunded for years. **Statewide, the formula would drive a \$1.8B investment over 15 years, increasing per-student resources by 60%.** For the first time in Illinois history this funding will be targeted and will come with accountability, as the state will ensure universities spend new money in ways that improve access, affordability, and degree completion for students.

SB13/HB1581 Means More Resources for Illinois Universities, Students, and Communities

By the time SB13/HB1581 is fully funded, the \$1.8B investment will produce an estimated 122,200 additional graduates.

Contribute \$342M more in local taxes



Spend \$5.3B more on local goods and services



Add \$691M to state tax revenue



Save the state \$156M in public assistance and incarceration costs

STUDENTS

- Greater college affordability
